Dear Bethlehem,

So much to cover. The last few months have been a whirlwind—planned and unplanned.

First, let me start with the most important thing:

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Without the suffering, death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, we would be lost eternally—without forgiveness, without peace, without hope, without purpose, without stability. If Christ hadn't been raised from the dead, our faith would be meaningless—so would our suffering and service in His name. But since Christ IS risen from the dead, our labor in Christ is never in vain. We can be stead-fast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord. (See 1 Corinthians 15.)

Second, I am heading down to Alabama and Georgia for my Annual Training and Inactive Duty Training days from April 2-29. Assuming everything goes to plan, I will have completed my minimum requirements for duty this Fiscal Year—through the end of September 2024. Again, thank you, dear congregation. Usually, we say "Thank you for your service" to military members. However, the spouses, children, and parents of military members are the ones who need to be thanked. Their sacrifice while their loved one goes away on temporary duty, training, or deployment is significant. The same is true for the "family of God" when it comes to letting me, your called pastor, to depart for temporary duty and training. So, dear Bethlehem, "Thank you for your service." My prayer is that you see how beneficial my chaplain duty is beneficial not only for our military members and their families but also for our congregation and school. This will be a future topic in my upcoming reports for the congregation.

Third, Bethlehem has completed 99% of our Ministry Clarity Process. We have a vision statement. We have defined four areas in our life together to enact our vision statement. We have analyzed and sought congregational input on what ministries our congregation has done and can continue, improve, or add in the future. We developed a draft Strategic 3-5 Year Plan, solicited feedback, and fine-tuned the plan accordingly. The Congregation passed the Strategic Plan unanimously on March 24. One piece of the Plan, Worship Pillar Goal #2, was requested to go back to the committee for reconsideration to be presented at the regular May Voters' Meeting. In the meantime, we can start implementing our agreed-upon goals. There's plenty to do and much good fruit to bear.

Fourth, Bethlehem hosted a meeting from interested churches and individuals who would like to see Lutheran Education extended through 12th grade. Due to many logistical and practical concerns, a full association among our LCMS churches in the Dayton area is not ideal at this time. However, the growing desire among the school families at Risen Christ Lutheran School, Springfield and at Bethlehem Lutheran School, Fairborn has implored us to at least look into the feasibility of offering a Lutheran High School. No commitments have been made-only the commitment to pray, ask questions, meet and discuss the what if's of a partnership between us and Risen Christ. If you (or anyone you know) might be interested in entrusting your children to a Lutheran High School, please take this survey-even if the children don't attend Bethlehem Lutheran School:



Fifth, finances at church have been a little tight over the last few months. Our expenditures are slightly above our giving. Please prayerfully consider (or reconsider) your giving. If you haven't taken a good look at your income in the past few months, especially if your income has increased, that's a good time to look at your giving. Has your giving increased proportionally as well? This is also good to do at tax time—you can see on a form how much God has provided for you in your net income and compare this to your giving. While a tithe, 10%, is not a Biblical requirement for Christians, it is an excellent goal AND easy math—slide the decimal point one place to the left. For some, 10% is not possible. But could 5% work? Or even 1%? Take on the challenge—to give first unto the Lord. For others, 10% is too little of a challenge. 




