Dear Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School,

When we pray, "Thy kingdom come," we are asking our dear Heavenly Father that the Holy Spirit would bring us and many others under God's gracious reign. As His children, we want God's Word to be proclaimed throughout the world, including by us, wherever we go.

The Word of God will continue to be proclaimed! How will we honor it and receive it? How will we share it, that it may speed ahead and be honored by others? Let me highlight a few of Bethlehem's opportunities—past, present, and future—to share the Word, that it may honored by more.

On September 22, we held a service and ministry fair. We set aside time for members and guests to see what our congregation does and offers. What a great time to learn more about the various groups and ministries, and a few signed up to join or try something new.

On October 12, our Dayton Circuit LCMS congregations have pooled resources together to bring a Seminary Professor from Fort Wayne. Rev. Gary Zieroth will present on "Marriage and Family in the United States Today." The presentation will be at Bethlehem from 9:00am to noon, with snacks starting at 8:30 and lunch afterwards, until 12:45pm.

Every week, from Monday through Friday, Bethlehem Lutheran School continues to teach the Word of God. Pray that it may speed ahead and be honored by every student and their families! If you're available, join us for chapel services on Wednesday mornings, 8:45am.

Every Sunday, the Word of God is read, preached, sung, and taught in Worship and Sunday School. There still is a little room left in Adult Bible Class at 9:30am. We are currently studying the Holy Gospel according to Matthew. On October 20, we will offer Matins non-communion services and a short communion service at 9:00am. On October 27, we will observe the Reformation, celebrating that the Word of God sped forth and was honored in the churches of the Holy Roman Empire once again. A group of students from our school will also sing at the 2nd service on October 27.

Every penny (or dollar) that we earn or are given provides an opportunity for the Word of God to speed forth and be honored. While there is no mandated requirement for offerings, a good practice that has withstood the test of time is 10%. It's easy math—move the decimal one place to the left and round off the last number. For some, giving 10% is too easy—consider giving more. For others, giving 10% may be difficult. If so, consider a smaller percentage. Even if it's 1%. And as God trains you and provides, slowly build up to 10% as a goal. It's good every once and a while to double check what God has provided through your income and what you give in return—and make adjustments as God guides, that the word of the Lord may speed forth from Bethlehem and be honored as it has happened among you.


