Dearly beloved of Bethlehem,

Our Lutheran School Ministry THEME, "Let's make a joyful noise" has brought many things to mind that I have often overlooked. As we celebrate the Reformation and All Saints' Day this year, I noticed how "noisy" a lot of our Psalms, Scripture readings, and hymns are. Have you noticed it, too?

Consider the hymn above from "Alleluia! Sing to Jesus." It pictures the saints and angels in heaven singing songs, thundering like a mighty flood. Martin Luther's Sanctus hymn, "Isaiah, Mighty Seer in Days of Old", captures the noise in heaven that takes place in Isaiah chapter 6. The seraphim praise the Lord in response to one another:

"Holy is God, the Lord of Sabaoth!
Holy is God, the Lord of Sabaoth!
Holy is God, the Lord of Sabaoth!
His glory fills the heavens and the earth!"
The beams and lintels trembled at the cry,
And clouds of smoke enwrapped the throne on high.

Imagine the noise of heaven shaking in anticipation as we are about to receive Christ's true body and blood at His Supper!

If you've ever been at a packed stadium for a game or at a rock concert, the noise level can be deafening, enveloping, invigorating. The walls shake. You might even "feel" the noise in your chest or from your feet. I picture heaven at that level—or close to it. However, without the pain—as our resurrected bodies will be able to tolerate whatever level God sees fit.

Until the Lord graciously takes us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven, we still make a joyful noise together here at Bethlehem. I love hearing the school children singing their hearts out to "This Is the Feast" at chapel. I love hearing the congregation singing the liturgy and favorite well-known hymns—accompanied by organ or even unaccompanied. It is a delight to hear your singing! I hear Luther's Small Catechism being recited as a group, by reading or by memory, at both our church and school. I hear Psalms spoken and chanted. I hear "Amen!" and "Alleluia!" "Thanks be to God!" spoken by young and old. I hear little ones cry out their prayers unto the Lord in His sanctuary. Bethlehem is a noisy place—and that is good.

Make a jouful noise to the LORD, all the earth; Break forth into joyous song and sing praises! Sing praises to the LORD with the lyre, With the lyre and the sound of melody! (Psalm 98:4-5)



Lincoln's Thanksgiving Proclamation

It is the duty of nations as well as of men to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God; to confess their sins and transgressions in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon; and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations are blessed whose God is the Lord.

We know that by His divine law, nations, like individuals, are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world. May we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war which now desolates the land may be a punishment inflicted upon us for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole people?

We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven; we have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity; we have grown in numbers, wealth and power as no other nation has ever grown.

But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us, and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us.

It seemed to me fit and proper that God should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and one voice, by the whole American people. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November as a day of Thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens.


Friday, November 7th is the PTO Fall Festival from 6pm - 8pm.


